The origins of the Regency romance are often traced to Jane Austen, who in writing about the life and people she knew, set the style for the Regencies of today. Although Austen is widely read today, it is Georgette Heyer who is the acknowledged doyenne of the modern traditional Regency. Influenced by turn-of-the-century writer Jeffery Farnol as well as the earlier Regency writers, Heyer employs exquisite language, attention to detail, knowledge of the period and its society, and an ability to create a vivid sense of place to set the standard for the modern Regency. While she has many imitators, she has few equals.
